Dear Parents and Carers,

Now that the sun is shining, please note the information below about sun cream and sandals. It is important that the children are given adequate protection before coming to school. Hats are also useful for lunchtime but please make sure they are labelled.

### National Tang Soo Do Championships



Congratulations to the St Bon's students who took part in the National Tang Soo Do Championships in Nottingham last weekend. There were three elements to the competition, Weapons and Forms (Hyungs), and Sparring. For the first two elements, the children must perform a set sequence of martial arts techniques and the judges are looking at discipline and accuracy as they perform the moves. The last element is sparring, where they fight! They are grouped according to their belt grade.

A team of 17 went from Bishopston Tang Soo Do aged between 5 and 77 years old. Seven students from St Bonaventure's were on the team. They all did amazingly well and five came home with a trophy. Vinnie 6D got 3rd place in Weapons, Emily H 6D got second place in Hyungs, Ivo 5K got 2nd place in Hyungs, Sean 4SA got second place in Hyungs, Luka 3CG got second place in Weapons.
