Dear Parents and Carers,

This week we remembered Mrs Joy Rigg (Mrs McGrath's mum) with the planting of a fruit tree in the school grounds. Father Tom led us in a blessing to commemorate Joy's life and her long connection with our school.

We have had our Section 48 inspection report back from the Diocese. We are delighted to be able to let you know that we remain an outstanding Catholic school. The report includes suggestions about where we can develop our religious education work further. We will of course take note of these so that our provision continues to improve.

The report contains many positive statements about the school including:

"The pupils' care and respect for each other make an excellent contribution to the ethos of the school, particularly in the positive role modelling of the older pupils for the younger children."

"The outcomes, provision and leadership and management for religious education (RE) are outstanding."

"The provision for the prayer life of the school and the pupils' wholehearted response are outstanding as is the effectiveness of the leadership and management in monitoring and evaluating the quality of its prayer life."

Thank you for all your support before and during the inspection and for the encouragement that you continue to give. A copy of the report is attached with the newsletter and is also available on the news section of our website as well as in the Information / RE section.

One of our pupils today found a £20 note on the road. Rather than keeping it for herself, this child wished to donate the money to CAFOD's Harvest appeal. Another pupil has donated money from having sold toys that she no longer uses. This is living out Gospel values in our own community and underlines our commitment to this term's core value of love.

On the same theme, thank you to everyone who has been so generous in donating food items for our Harvest collection. This will be going to Crisis Centre Ministries who support our city's most vulnerable people.

Finally, I would like to wish everyone a very restful half term break. It has been an extremely long term, particularly for our new Reception children. Rest and relax!

Mr Mico, one of our parents, will be going with the boxes this year and will be taking photographs for us so we can see where our boxes end up.


