### **Class PE days**

Children in years 1-6 will be required to wear their school PE kit (white T-shirt and navy shorts/skort/cycling shorts) and trainers on the days below in term 1. These may be subject to change once the term settles down, but you will be informed of any changes:

On all other days, children should come to school in their full uniform.

Any child attending a sporting after school club, on a day when they do not have PE, should bring their PE kit in a bag and will get changed into it at the end of the school day. Please send children in with their school PE kit for clubs (white T-shirt, navy shorts or skort), not football club strips.

Children in Reception are not required to wear a PE kit into school and should come into school wearing their school uniform every day.

We will be holding a regular dress down day on the last day of each term – all other Fridays children should wear school uniform please. Children can still wear home clothes on their birthday (or nearest day).

Morning drop off arrangements will remain in place this term. All parents of children in years 1-6 should drop their children off at the main school gates each morning. Reception parents are invited to wait with their child at the wooden gate in front of the Reception area.
