# Dyslexia and Australian Flower Bush Essence – a project

Gordon Adam has been a volunteer at St Bon's since 2013, supporting children in Year 5 with reading. Gordon is also a practising Homeopath (since 1988) and has treated many children with dyslexia (including issues with reading, writing, spelling, word recall, etc) over the years, mainly using a particular flower essence, and with generally very good results.



This particular flower essence is made from the flower Bush Fuchsia (*Epacris longiflora – see photo*) which grows in Eastern Australia. Flower essences are made by immersing the flowers (in full bloom) in spring water in a glass bowl and leaving it exposed to sunlight for a period of several hours. The energetic essence of the flower gets absorbed into the water with the help of sunlight. The water is then sieved and filtered and some brandy added as a preservative – this is called the 'stock' essence which is bottled and made available commercially. For dosage purposes, several drops of the stock essence are added to spring or filtered water along with a little brandy in a dropper bottle. The usual dose for Australian Bush Essences is seven drops twice a day.

With support from the school, Gordon will be running a project early in the New Year, where Bush Fuchsia will be made available to dyslexic children (in any year group) and their progress with the essence monitored over a period of 3 months. Some children respond very quickly to the essence (within minutes!) whilst with others, progress is slower, taking several weeks or even a few months to see the full effect. For this reason, the project will run for 3 months (from time of starting on the essence). A 30ml dropper bottle of the essence, which lasts about 3 weeks, will be supplied for £5 (to cover material costs). An update, by email, would be sent to Gordon

at the completion of each bottle, and a further bottle of the essence made available (from the school office) if appropriate.

A meeting (or possibly 2 meetings at different times of day) for anyone interested in taking part in the project will be held in the school early in the New Year where more information will be offered and any questions answered – please look out for details in the first school newsletters of 2023.
