Dear Parents and Carers,

Firstly, I must congratulate all the children, staff, parents and other helpers who have worked so hard to produce an absolutely wonderful production of The Jungle Book. This is despite various challenges being thrown at the team, including Mrs McGrath tearing ligaments in her hand after a bike accident.

The costumes, sets, music and lighting were all beautifully put together and have taken many hours of voluntary time by lots of people. The show really is a highlight in the year for many of our children who are given such a wonderful opportunity to showcase their acting and musical abilities. I am assured by parents at other schools that St Bon's productions really are a cut above the rest!

Special mention must of course go to Mrs McGrath and Miss Cousins without whom these shows simply would not happen. Their commitment of time and energy are not to be underestimated.

Could I ask parents to maintain vigilance with children's online activities. Social media and messaging services such as WhatsApp provide lots of opportunities for fun and interaction, but can also be a source of stress. Please remind your children that they should not say anything about another child that may cause upset. This applies whether that child is in a messaging group or not. One child's perceived 'friendly banter' can cause real distress to another child.

On another matter, I have to write again about parking. Could I remind parents that it is illegal to park on the white zig zag lines by zebra crossings – this applies to the crossing at the junction of Birchall Road and Kings Drive near the tennis club. A local resident has reported to us that she saw a car pull onto the pavement where these markings are in order to drop a child at our school.
