Within the city of Bristol, the guide ranks St Bonaventure's as fifth in Bristol's top 10 schools.

St Bonaventure's offers a broad and balanced curriculum in a modern building with outstanding facilities. We have state of the art provision for sports, music and creative arts. We place our emphasis on sport, nurturing pupils' wider personal development as well as their academic well-being and provide a caring and supportive environment where all children can excel.

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CURRICULUM

We pride ourselves on the quality of our curriculum which is skills based and provides our pupils with experiential learning opportunities.

Focused curriculum weeks for Science, History and Geography are implemented throughout the year. During these weeks English and Maths are taught within these topics and pupils are provided with real life opportunities to engage in meaningful learning outcomes.

When starting school at St Bonaventure's, our Reception environment offers outstanding provision. Class teachers and learning support assistants work together to foster pupil's independence, supporting both social and academic outcomes so that the vast majority of pupils achieve the Early Learning Goals at the end of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS).

We have two specialist rooms, dedicated to Art/DT and Music. Our astro turf pitch ensures we are able to offer a variety of sporting experiences all year round. We also look for opportunities to bring in specialist support such as golf, archery and fencing.

10% of our curriculum is dedicated to the teaching of RE. Pupils participate enthusiastically in and respond impressively to the prayer life of the school. Alongside academic achievement we also focus on lifelong learning skills. We support our pupils to become resilient learners, who persevere and develop a positive attitude towards challenge.

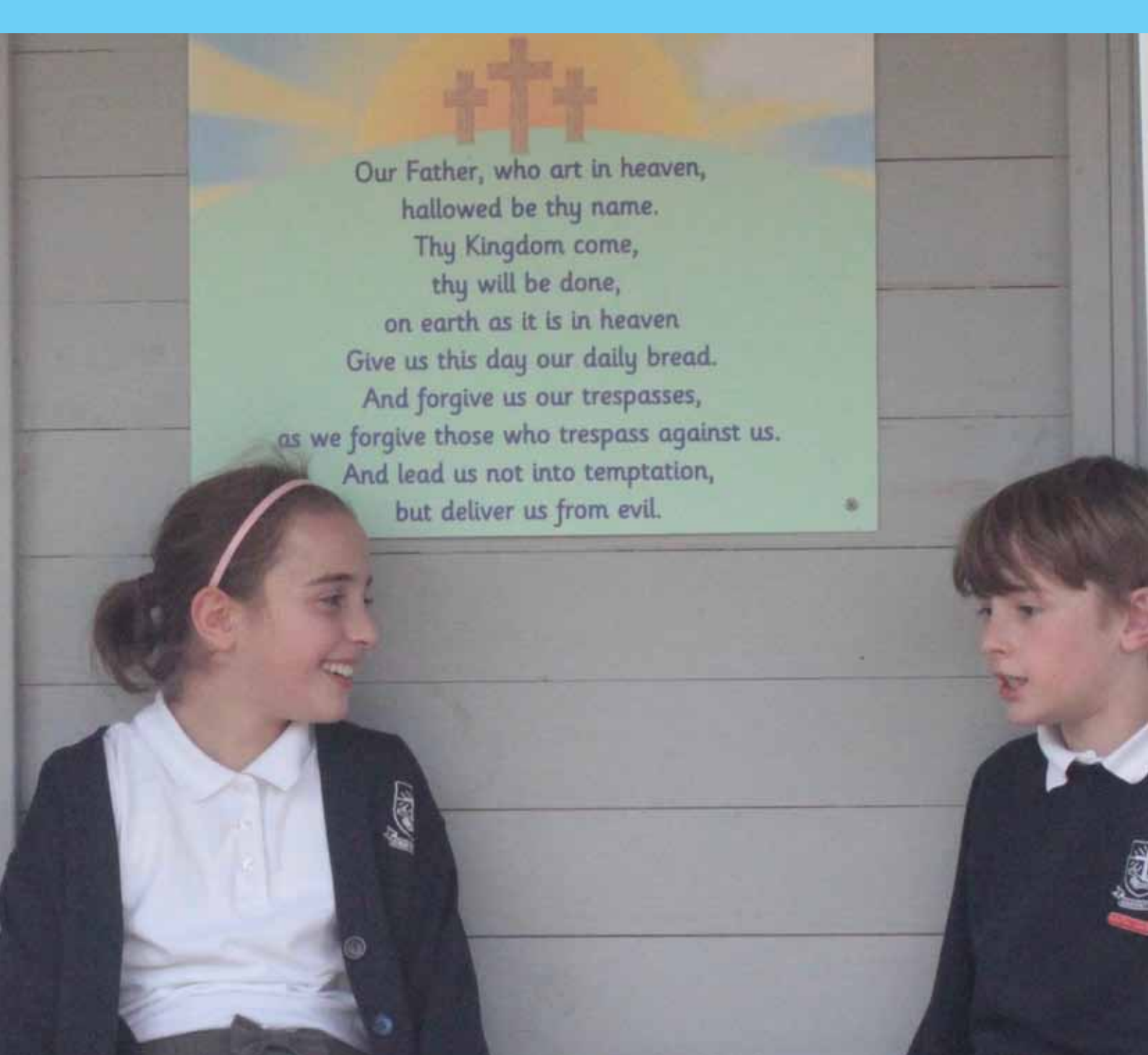
Our annual KS2 drama performance is always fully subscribed and results in a memorable performance for all involved. We offer a range of musical opportunities such as choir, orchestra, brass, string and piano. Pupils are taught to play the recorder from year 1 into upper KS2.

Our annual Easter festival day is possibly the most memorable event in our school diary. Pupils have the opportunity to enter art work, take part in poetry recitals, singing and dance performances, all competing within their house teams. The winning team receives our Easter festival plaque. Parents and members of the wider community join us for this day of celebration.

All KS2 pupils are encouraged to attend residential visits. Visits focus on team work, sporting experiences and character building activities which support our vision for lifelong learners.
