

Kids and Smartphones



Many of you will already be aware of the national conversation that's sprung up since February about the age at which we give our children smartphones. There's a growing movement of parents who are concerned about their kids using smartphones, particularly at primary school age.

Some St Bon's parents have got together to begin talking about how we might raise awareness of the issue at our school. While we recognise the huge benefits of technology, we're concerned that spending too much time on smartphones at a young age, and particularly social media, is harmful. We certainly don't have all the answers, but we hope to get St Bon's parents talking about this in a non-judgemental way.

The school is already embracing the conversation. Last week we were visited by Susie Davies from Papaya, a charity which specialises in teen mental health and technology, who gave an excellent talk setting out the risks of smartphones and gaming. If you're interested in finding out more, Susie's slides are <u>here</u>.

We'd also highly recommend a talk by social psychologist Jonathan Haidt, who has been featured on Radio 4 and in other mainstream media.

We are working on more ways to offer support and information, and in the meantime, you can expect to hear from us more regularly in future.
