St. Bons: Faith in Action This Week!

This week at St. Bons has been an enriching journey of faith, as our children continue to embrace the spirit of Lent with open hearts and thoughtful actions. Our chaplaincy teams have been particularly active, guiding our school community through meaningful reflections and prayerful experiences.

Our week began with a reflection led by our Year 6 chaplains, who focused on the scripture of Jesus washing the disciples' feet. This act of humble service set the tone for the week, inviting us all to consider how we can follow Jesus' example in our own lives. The symbolic activity for the week involved decorating a human figure with clothing or symbols that represent how each child intends to follow Jesus. We are looking forward to seeing these creative expressions of faith in next week's Lent reflection!

Year 5 chaplains have been preparing a Stations of the Cross service for next week. They have thoughtfully re-enacted each station in a series of freeze frames, which will form the heart of our service. Our Year 1 pupils also had the opportunity to visit the church for their own reflection on the Stations of the Cross, bringing this journey of faith to even our youngest learners.

Our Celebrations of the Word this week centred on the parable of the Lost Son, a story that illustrates God's boundless love and forgiveness. To encourage personal reflection, the children were invited to end each school day with a simple Examen prayer, reflecting on their experiences and interactions throughout the day.

Years 5 and 6 participated in a series of prayer stations, offering diverse avenues for connection with God. These stations included:

- Receiving a letter from God, affirming His unconditional love.
- Creating personalised cards for God.
- Engaging in journaling, providing a space for private communication with God.
- Writing prayers for the world, fostering a sense of global solidarity.
- Creating personal representations of God, encouraging individual expression of faith.

The school has also been buzzing with creative energy as all children have contributed artwork for our "Seek the Truth" Catholic Social Teaching (CST) principles art competition. During our assembly today, several children were chosen to explain their designs, highlighting the connection between their artwork and the CST principles.

In our "Walk the Walk" assembly, each year group shared their progress on their "Seek the Truth" Faith Awards, demonstrating how their actions align with the CST principles of Solidarity, Option for the Poor and Vulnerable, and the Common Good. This presentation will be shared on our school website, allowing everyone to witness the inspiring work of our children. We also took time to celebrate individual children who consistently exemplify Gospel values and the CST principles.

As always, we are immensely proud of our children's commitment to living out their faith and their unwavering dedication to doing good. Their enthusiasm and compassion are a testament to the strong Catholic ethos that permeates St. Bons.


























Chaplains Chat -


