End of year parent/carer survey July 2024

Thank you to everyone who engaged with our end of year survey in July. In total 69 individuals completed the survey. We will be using what you have told us to make changes and tweaks throughout this year. Thank you.

The following is a summary of the most frequently identified strengths and what we could do to improve.

Strengths:

- 99% of parents/carers state their child/ren feels safe at school.
- 99% of parents/carers state their child/ren is happy at school.
- Nurturing community environment.
- Inclusivity.

- Caring ethos.
- Approachable staff team.

What we could do to improve:

- Streamline communication.
- Being kept up to date with children's progress throughout the year.
- Regarding sporting events, advanced notice for after school events and provision of school organised transport when taking place within the school day.
- More opportunities for EYFS & KS1 pupils to take part in extracurricular clubs.
- Improve communication for parents/carers of SEND pupils.
- Consistency between same year group classes, e.g. homework, use of google classroom.

We already have some ideas about what we're going to do to improve and act upon your feedback. We're going to be working closely with our parent focus group and staff teams and will keep you updated as we move through the new school year.


