A charity close to our hearts

I want to draw your attention to The Amber Townson Foundation that has been set up by Glen and Tara in memory of their daughter, Amber:

This weekend (16th June) also aptly on Father's Day I will be taking on my first Half Ironman - Wild Boar 70.3 in memory of Amber. Following this Half Ironman 2 weeks later; I will also be completing a 100 mile ride with some close friends inclusive of Amber's godfather on the 30th June, just a few days after what would have been her 3rd Birthday.

Amber was a beautiful, cheeky little girl who brought us so much joy. Following her death we have created a foundation in her name 'The Amber Townson Foundation' (registered charity number: 1208420) to support the prevention of Sudden Death In Childhood, also referred to as SUDC. Sudden death in childhood is the 4th leading cause of death in childhood and most commonly affects 1-4 year olds. Sadly, the cause is unknown and funding for further research is needed to prevent this happening to more children.

**Growing God's Kingdom at St. Bon's**

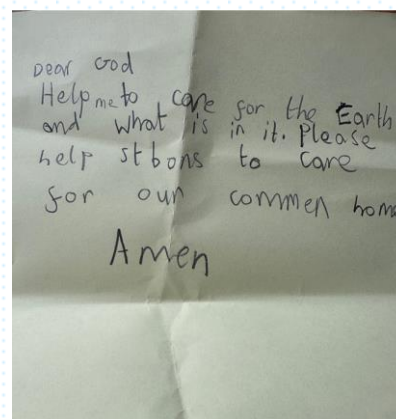
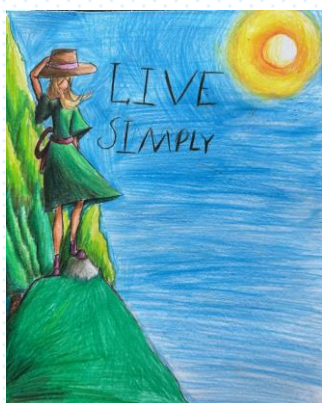
