#### St. Bons: Faith in Action This Week!

This week at St. Bon's has been a tapestry of faith, reflection, and community spirit, as we continue our Lenten journey and embrace the call to be Pilgrims of Hope.

We kicked off the week with a joyful celebration of St. Patrick's Day. Our St. Patrick's House Captains led a special assembly, sharing the inspiring story of St. Patrick's life, his powerful prayer, and his enduring relevance in our lives today. The sea of green worn by the St. Patrick's house members, and the themed biscuits, brought a real sense of celebration to our school community.

Our dedicated Chaplaincy Teams have been working hard, guiding us through our Lenten reflections and our journey as Pilgrims of Hope. On Tuesday, our Year 6 Chaplaincy Team led a whole school reflection on the theme of "Hard Times," reminding us that Jesus is always with us, especially during moments of challenge. Classes then took time to reflect further, using the rock from the "Lent in a Bag" resource, and will be sharing their insights with the school in next week's reflection.

Later in the week, our Year 5 Chaplaincy Team presented a thoughtful assembly on "Pilgrims of Hope." They explained the elements of the Pilgrims of Hope logo and shared their personal interpretations. Children had the opportunity to express their own ideas through oracy, and the Chaplaincy Team then outlined their plans for completing our Pilgrims of Hope journey throughout the rest of the year.

Looking ahead, we are excited to participate in the CAFOD Big Lent Walk during the last week of term. This important event will raise funds for communities in Africa impacted by climate change. In line with Catholic Social Teaching principles, our Chaplaincy Team explained how climate change has made these communities vulnerable, and how we can show solidarity by raising money and walking with buckets of water to and from Horfield Common. We will be walking in their shoes to show our understanding and support.

In our Celebration of the Word assemblies this week, we reflected on the powerful account of the Transfiguration from Luke's Gospel. The children were invited to find a quiet space to enter into God's presence and spend time with Him, picturing Jesus shining brightly on the mountaintop.

This week has been a reminder of our faith, our community, and our commitment to making a positive difference in the world. We look forward to continuing our Lenten journey and our Pilgrims of Hope journey together.









## **Chaplains Chat -**

In planning the Jubilee Pilgrims of Hope assembly this week, the Year 5 chaplains talked about what the logo means to them:



#### The people

The people are coming from all parts of the earth and are going towards God. Some people need him more in their lives and some people don't know they need him in their lives. It links to the Beatitudes when Jesus tells us that the people who are poor in some way are blessed by God (Sophia)

#### The cross

The cross is a sign of hope for people who need it. It's also a spark of faith in someone's life. In the logo all the people are clinging on to each other. The cross is a sign of hope and faith in our lives. The cross stretches out towards people as a sign of hope. It helps us to hold on to our faith especially in our greatest need. (Lorenzo)

#### The waves

The waves represent when you are in a hard time your waves are rough and fast flowing, but when you take time and connect to God your waves become calm and slow flowing. We can have hard times but if we focus on God our waves will be calm.
