Catholic Life at St Bon's this week

This week has been a busy and blessed one here at St. Bon's, filled with faith, reflection, and joyful learning.

We began the week with the exciting launch of the Jubilee Year, "Pilgrims of Hope" The whole school watched the inspiring CAFOD launch assembly, and our Year 5 chaplains took the lead, distributing journey maps, prayer cards, and stickers to everyone. These resources will guide us throughout the year as we explore what it means to be pilgrims of hope. Our Year 5 chaplains also held a productive meeting this week, sharing their brilliant ideas for completing all the actions on the journey map. We look forward to hearing more from them and participating in these activities together as a school community.

Our Key Stage 2 Gospel Value assembly focused on the important theme of supporting refugees. We shared the moving story of a refugee from Afghanistan, prompting the children to reflect on how we can show compassion and make refugees in our community, and especially in our school, feel welcome and safe. The children's thoughtful contributions highlighted their understanding of empathy and the importance of reaching out to those in need.

During our Celebrations of the Word this week, we heard the beautiful Gospel story of Jesus' presentation in the temple and Simeon's joy at recognizing him. The children were invited to reflect on times when they have recognised the presence of Jesus in their own lives. It was truly inspiring to hear their thoughtful and reflective responses. Even our youngest children spoke of Jesus being at their side during difficult times, and also when they are in a beautiful place, demonstrating a deep understanding of His constant presence in our lives.

Every week, children from across the school take the lead in supporting the faith journey of others. Children in each class have the opportunity to plan and deliver reflections for their classmates. This week, a group of children from 4G led their class in a reflection on friendship, reminding us of the importance of love and support within our community.

Finally, 3J's class assembly provided a joyous and humorous link between their History topic on the Egyptians and our school theme of "Seek the Truth." Through song, narration, and drama, they brought ancient Egyptian history to life, demonstrating their learning in a creative and engaging way.

It has been a truly enriching week, filled with opportunities for growth in faith and understanding. We are so proud of all our children and their commitment to living out the Gospel values.




