This week at St Bon's, we've embarked on our Advent journey, a time of preparation and anticipation for the birth of Jesus Christ. Our Year 6 chaplains led a beautiful whole-school reflection, setting the tone for the weeks ahead.

During our Celebration of the Word assemblies, we've explored ways to deepen our relationship with Jesus. We've decorated our classroom reflection areas with purple cloths, nativity scenes, and Advent wreaths, to create a prayerful atmosphere. Our focus has been on preparing our hearts to welcome Jesus by spending quality time in prayer and reflection.





Our Year 6 chaplains have diligently crafted a Saints Trail, providing narratives about each of our school saints. These narratives highlight the saints' lives, their contributions to the Church, and how their examples can inspire us today.
