Many of our children have already shown their generosity by supporting the food bank for Harvest. Now, we are turning our attention to helping homeless people in Bristol over the winter. We are collecting clothing, gifts, cards, and fundraising to deliver to the Julian shelter before the end of term.



A special shout-out goes to a group of Year 4 children who are planning their own fundraising craft stall on 15th November. Their goal is to raise enough money for a CAFOD world gift to teach a class to read in a country where children don't have easy access to education. And Scarlett in Year 5 went above and beyond by making her own collection of socks and toiletries for the Julian Trust.



On Thursday, we celebrated our Harvest Mass in the church. The children looked beautiful in their bright colours and brought in money to support CAFOD. 6WA and 5B also donated food items to the church food bank. Joes bakery generously donated two harvest loaves, which were shared among all the children as we reflected on the gifts of creation.

Although All Saints' Day falls during half term, we will be celebrating it when we return with a special assembly and reflections led by the children. On Friday, 8th November, we are inviting everyone to adopt a saint for the day. Children will research a saint and dress up or wear something that represents them. For Key Stage 2 children, we are asking them to think about what their saint would think of the world today and what they would do to help. They will be sharing their information with their classmates.

It has been a wonderful week of service and reflection, and we are proud of our children for their compassion and generosity.




Think about all of the wonderful people who have done extraordinary things for Christ.
