Celebrating Catholic Life at St. Bonaventure's!

This week, our school community has been immersed in exploring Catholic social teaching (CST) and living out the "Love thy neighbour" theme.

In Monday's ethos assembly, 6WA shared their insightful definitions of CST, highlighting its importance in our lives. We have been learning more about CST principles of Human dignity, Family and Community, and Rights and Responsibilities. All classes are actively considering how they can support those in need as they work towards their faith award outcomes.



To further engage with CST, we launched an exciting art competition. Children are invited to design a character, logo, or piece of artwork that represents each of the CST principles. The competition is open to all pupils and we look forward to seeing their creative interpretations towards the end of term 2

Our school leadership team has also been strengthened this week. The newly elected house captains and prefects, chosen by their peers, will play a vital role in ensuring our school remains a safe and happy place for everyone.

At the end of the week our Year 6 chaplaincy team shared their experiences with Year 5, discussing the qualities of a chaplain and the responsibilities involved. Our new chaplains will be attending training with other Catholic schools after half term, further developing their leadership skills.

As part of our Go Bright for Harvest campaign, we are encouraging children to wear bright clothes and bring £1 to school next Thursday. The funds raised will contribute to a CAFOD world gift, chosen by the children themselves. Our harvest mass, led by Year 5, will also take place on Thursday at 9.15 AM. 6WA and 5B will be collecting food bank contributions to support the local community as part of their work towards their Love thy Neighbour faith awards.

In today's class assembly, 6WA revisited the parable of the Good Samaritan, connecting it to first aid and the importance of caring for others. We learned valuable first aid tips and explored charities that provide medical assistance in places impacted by extreme weather and war. 6WA's performance of "Heal the World" served as a powerful reminder of our responsibility to work towards a better world.


Think about all of the wonderful people who have done extraordinary things for Christ.

We look forward to seeing and hearing what you come up with!






First Holy Communion 2025
