# Catholic Life at St Bon's this week

This week at St Bons, we've been exploring what it means to let our lights shine.

• **"Walk the Walk" Assembly:** We celebrated the impact of our "Love thy Neighbour" theme, with input from the children who visited the Julian Shelter last term. They shared their moving experiences, highlighting the challenges faced by homeless people and the vital work of the shelter. We also recognized individuals and groups who have gone above and beyond to support charities and show kindness to others. Emilio, Vincenzo, and Illaria from Year 6 shared their inspiring acts of kindness with the school.





- **Certificates of Excellence:** Teachers presented certificates to children who exemplify "Seek the Truth" by standing up for fairness and equality, helping to create safe and happy learning environments for everyone.
- Year 5 Charity Fundraiser: After school today, some Year 5 pupils have organised a sale of crafts and cakes to support For-Ethiopia, a local charity working to alleviate poverty in Ethiopia.




