What a powerful final week of term it's been, truly embracing our Catholic life here at St Bons as we journey towards the joy of Easter! Our wonderful chaplaincy team really led the way, guiding us in thoughtful reflection and prayer.

Monday saw a beautiful start with our Lent reflection, centred around the final object in each classes 'Lent in a Bag', the candle. The children spent time considering how they, like Jesus, can let their own lights shine brightly in the world.

On Tuesday, the school community came together for our moving Stations of the Cross service. Our Year 5 chaplaincy brought each station to life with carefully prepared freeze frames. Two of our chaplains then led us in thoughtful reflections, helping us to connect with Jesus's journey to the cross and think about the challenges we face in our own lives. It was so insightful to hear the children's reflections afterwards in class. They particularly appreciated the "time to be quiet," the "prayerful atmosphere," and the thought-provoking "questions they asked us to think about." The "freeze frames" and the overall "quiet and calm" also resonated deeply with them.

Monday was also a day for action as we embarked on our Big Lent Walk, a key part of our Jubilee Year Pilgrims of Hope journey. It was inspiring to see all the children, staff, and some of our parishioners walking in solidarity with communities supported by CAFOD. Carrying those buckets of water really brought home the challenges faced by so many. We are thrilled to announce that we collectively walked over 1000km and have already raised a fantastic £275! Let's keep that generosity flowing and help us reach our target – every little bit makes a difference!

Our journey continued on Wednesday as the whole school gathered at church for our Passiontide Mass. It was a truly special occasion, made even more so by the thoughtful Year 5 chaplains who had created Easter cards for our parishioners. These cards were blessed at the offertory, and given out by the chaplains at the end of Mass. Mgr Barnard shared some insights with the children about the Beatitudes, reminding us that when we make the sign of the cross, we are asking for God's help to let our lights shine and follow in Jesus's footsteps.

Today Our Easter Festival has been a vibrant celebration of creativity and community spirit. From beautifully decorated Easter eggs and carefully crafted Easter gardens to stunning artwork, the children's talents have been on full display. And of course, the Easter bonnet parade this morning was an absolute joy! Throughout the day, the energy has been fantastic as the houses competed in singing, poetry, and dancing – definitely a day where everyone let their lights shine!
