St. Bons: Faith in Action This Week!

This week at St. Bons has been a whirlwind of faith-filled activities, showcasing our children's deep understanding and commitment to living out our Catholic values.

We kicked off the week with an inspiring assembly launching our Catholic Social Teaching (CST) art competition, centred around our Gospel theme, "Seek the Truth." Our pupils explained CST as "your faith in action," "you have faith in God which makes you do good things," and "you are doing something small to make a big difference." We explored this term's CST principles, with Alex (Year 5) defining Solidarity as "showing you care for others in your daily life," Lorenzo (Year 5) explaining the Common Good as "doing something for everyone," and Sofia (Year 4) highlighting the Option for the Poor and Vulnerable as "equity for everyone." We were so impressed with the children's understanding. Following this, the children will create their own designs for each of this terms CST principles based on their discussion and understanding. These designs will be used to create St Bons symbols for each of the CST principles.

Our Key Stage 2 Gospel Value Assembly continued our focus on refugees and becoming a School of Sanctuary. Karina (Year 6) bravely shared her moving experience of leaving Ukraine and her challenging journey to England. Hearing her story first hand was incredibly impactful for our children. They discussed how Karina had become vulnerable and explored how we can "put refugees first." Their insightful responses, such as "if we work for peace in the world, people wouldn't have to leave their homes and become vulnerable," demonstrated a deep understanding of CST in action.

In our Key Stage 1 Celebration of the Word assembly this week, we focused on the word "action," emphasizing the importance of doing the right thing and showing kindness. We are blessed to have so many pupils who "walk the walk" in their actions to support others.

Friday was a riot of colour and creativity with our "Funky Hair Day," organised by our Year 2 pupils to raise awareness and funds for communities in Bangladesh impacted by climate change. We are so proud of their initiative!

We also celebrated the incredible generosity of our pupils. Jack's fundraising for the Julian Shelter at the end of last term raised a fantastic £234.85! And Rosa (Year 5) is showing immense compassion by cutting her hair and fundraising for the Little Princess Trust, providing real hair wigs for children who have lost their hair due to cancer treatment.

These are just a few examples of how our children are living out their faith and embodying the principles of Catholic Social Teaching. At St. Bons, we are truly witnessing the power of faith in action, making a real difference in the world around us.
