READING KARATE

Reading Karate Belt Chart

Reading is a life long skill and at St Bons we to encourage reading for pleasure.

This week, we launched our 'Reading Karate' scheme. Reading Karate is a reward-based system for reading at home, which results in the children moving up through coloured 'belts', depending on how many times they have read.

EYFS/KS1

In EYFS/KS1 we will ask **adults** to number, sign and date their reading records. Only **1 read per day** will count. For every 20 reads, we are asking for the **children to show** their reading record to the teacher/LSA and they will get presented a certificate. After 'black belt', it increases to every 40 reads. At the end of the year, Miss Jones would like to celebrate our 'Gold' readers and do a fun activity with them. Reading Karate is then reset for the next school year.

We want children to grow a love for reading, so alongside the levelled school books, children can share/read their own book of choice. We don't expect a whole book to be read! A few pages each night is fine. Reading Karate is more about how often you read, not how many books.

KS2

From Year 3 all the way to Year 6, children will work to getting their Dans, Masters, Sensei and Hall of Fame status. This is a continuous journey, where it will not be reset over the summer holidays, so by the end of year 6, children become a reading sensei.

For 24/25, to give pupils a chance of reaching 'Sensei' status by end of Y6, year 4 will start at 'White Dan' (200 reads), Yr5 at 'Blue Dan' (400 reads) and year 6 at 'Orange Reading Master' level (650 reads). Every new year 3 will work towards achieving White-Orange Dan status by the end of year 3. Miss Jones is looking into getting 'bands' that children can get for each belt that can be traded in for the next one to go alongside certificates.

As you read with your child, please **remember to number/ date/sign the reading records**. **One read per day counts**. Alongside the levelled school books, children can share/read

their own book of choice. At the end of the year, Miss Jones would like to celebrate our 'sensei's' and do a fun activity with them.
