## St. Bons Catholic Life - A Week of Reflection and Hope

It has been a poignant start to the new term here at St. Bons. We returned on Monday to the sad news of the passing of Pope Francis. Our school community gathered for a special assembly where we watched a short film celebrating his life and the profound inspiration he offered to us all. At the entrance to our school, we have created a reflection area, a quiet space for us to remember Pope Francis and his enduring legacy. As Jacob, one of our thoughtful Year 5 chaplains, shared in our meeting this week, "We need to carry on his good work and mission as Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee year."

This sentiment resonated during our school Mass today, where Mgr. Bernard spoke about Pope Francis' humility and the simple life he embraced, a powerful example for us all.

Our spiritual journey continued on Tuesday with an assembly focused on Mark's Gospel and the powerful scripture of the women at Jesus' tomb discovering his resurrection. The children thoughtfully reflected on the emotions of Jesus' disciples at that moment and the profound impact the resurrection has on Jesus' followers today. The overwhelming message was one of hope, a theme that has continued to inspire our child-led reflections in classrooms throughout the week.

Wednesday brought a splash of red to St. Bons as we celebrated St George's Day. Our enthusiastic house captains led a wonderful assembly, sharing details about the life of St George and the diverse ways his feast day is celebrated across the globe. They even brought the legendary tale of St George and the dragon to life through drama and treated us to a lively demonstration of traditional English Morris dancing, complete with bells and sticks - an energetic performance that inspired Year 1 to try their own moves in the afternoon! Reflecting on our school saints always reminds us of how they lived out their faith, hope, and love, offering us inspiration for our own lives, and our house captains certainly helped us to do just that.

Year 4 enjoyed a special visit this week from volunteers from the local B&A church, who led an engaging "Easter in a box" session. Through a series of interactive activities, the children explored the key events of Easter and were delighted to take home their own Easter treasure boxes filled with meaningful reminders of the Easter story.

Following our pre-holiday art competition, I have been so impressed by the beautiful images of Mary created by the children. Many included heartfelt prayers, inspiring scripture quotes, and thoughtful descriptions of her wonderful qualities. Some of these artistic expressions will feature in our Crowning of Mary service next Thursday, while others will be displayed around the school throughout May.

In exciting news, the PTFA have kindly funded gardening kits for every class! As part of our Jubilee year as Pilgrims of Hope, each class will be planting their own "seeds of kindness." We will be launching this initiative in our assembly on Monday, and all the children will have the opportunity to plant their seeds next week. They will nurture their seedlings in the greenhouse until they are ready to be planted in class pots, bringing beauty and life to our school grounds.

It has been a busy and reflective start to the term, and we look forward to continuing our journey together as a school community, guided by faith, hope, and love.
