I hope you all had a great half term and are ready for the busy term head of us. Please make a note of the key dates listed below but note that there will be other events specific to your class or year group to look out for.

Attendance and punctuality

I'd like to thank you all for your continued support in ensuring your child/ren are in school every day and arrive at school on time. If you would ever like to meet with me to discuss any difficulties you are having getting your child/ren to school or ensuring they arrive before the bell please do reach out to me.

Requests for term time absence must be submitted using the form available on our website or school office two weeks in advance of the absence.

If you do need to take your child out of school during the school day the office team will ask you for a copy of the appointment so that I can consider if it will be authorised. Please note not all requests for appointments in the school day can be authorised due to statutory legislation.

Uniform

It has been brought to my attention that a number of children are wearing items of their own clothes to school, sweatshirts in particular. Can I please remind you that children must wear full school uniform, this includes a navy sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo on, in warmer weather they can wear a white polo shirt on its own. They should not be wearing home clothes whilst in school.

Parking

I have received several emails this week from parents and local residents about parking.

It has been reported to me that there was an incident in the church car park last term where a parent has driven too close to a parked car and has hit the open door whilst a child was waiting to get in. Luckily no one was hurt. Please can I remind all parents/carers who use the church car park to do so with care and consideration.

I have also been made aware that several cars parked close to the school have had leaflets placed on them advising them not to park on pedestrian routes. If you are responsible for the distribution of these fliers please be mindful of the local residents who live close to the school as I would not want to cause upset to our neighbours.

Catholic Life at St Bons: A Week of Compassion and Action!

What a busy first week back we've had at St. Bons,! Our Chaplaincy Team has been at the heart of many of the activities, embodying our school's commitment to faith in action.

The week began with an assembly led by our Year 5 and 6 Chaplains. They shared their vision for the re-opening of the St. Francis Garden, a tranquil space for prayer and reflection during lunchtimes. Their enthusiasm was infectious as they outlined their ideas and expectations, and we were delighted to see the garden officially re-opened for Year 3 pupils on Monday. The feedback from both the Chaplaincy Team and the Year 3 children was overwhelmingly positive.

On Wednesday, some of our Year 5 Chaplains led another inspiring assembly, this time to launch the next exciting stage of our "Pilgrims of Hope" journey. Every child in the school is invited to produce a piece of art on the theme of hope. This initiative not only encourages creativity but also allows our children to reflect on what hope means to them. Some of these artworks will be selected to go forward into the Cardinal Newman Trust Art Competition. The response has been incredible, with entries already flooding in all week as many classes have already completed their masterpieces!

Wednesday afternoon saw the entire Chaplaincy Team attend training with Jane from Bristol Schools Connection and volunteers from local churches. This session was crucial for planning our own school pilgrimage for the upcoming Jubilee Year of Hope. Our Chaplains engaged enthusiastically in prayer and reflection-based activities, identifying the key features of effective prayer stations. They then began the process of planning their own prayer stations, all centred around the theme of hope. Their collaborative spirit and the thoughtful, reflective activities they're creating are inspiring. Over the next few weeks, they will continue to refine their plans for the pilgrimage walk, which will take place in the last week of term.

Today, we took another significant step in our "Live Simply" plan with a "Buy Less, Share More" event, organised by our Stewardship Team. Children brought in good quality toys and books they no longer needed and then had the opportunity to choose a "new" treasure from the donated items. It was heart-warming to see so many children overjoyed with their new acquisitions, fostering a spirit of generosity and resourcefulness within our school community.

Beyond these official initiatives, the spirit of service and fundraising is alive and well across St. Bons! In addition to our "Run for H2O" next Friday, many groups of children are organising their own fundraising activities to help us reach our ambitious £10,000 target for H2O. A special plea comes from a group of Year 4 girls who would love your help with their fundraising efforts: they are asking for any old t-shirts you have at home to be left in a box by the office. These resourceful girls will then transform the donated t-shirts into stylish tote bags for a sale on July 4th - what a fantastic idea! Not to be outdone, a group of Year 5 boys will be holding a raffle in the week commencing June 16th to win a signed Bristol Rovers shirt, and they'll also be selling delicious cakes after school on June 19th.

As you can see, our St. Bons community is thriving with faith, service, and a boundless spirit of hope. We are incredibly proud of all our children for their commitment to living out our Catholic values each and every day.

Dear supporters - This year with your help I hope to raise £10,000 to support another water project in Ethiopia, Arat Ber (last year we raised £8,055). We are really lucky this year as we have someone who is going to **match fund** the monies raised by the children up to £5K (more information here (https://www.stewardship.org.uk/pages/RunforH2O2025) we have been given us a target of £10k which means for every £1 raised, each child will get an additional 50p, £10 = £5, £20 = £10 etc. AMAZING!!

In the week leading up to Friday 13th June - the day of the event there will be an opportunity to buy tickets to enter into a raffle to either win a signed Bristol Bears top or a signed Gloucestershire Cricket T20 top. Cash or card will be accepted.





We will be **running** the distance of a **marathon** around the muga and playground shared between the children - listed below:

R - 1: 42.2 / 60 = 0.7 Km = 3 ½ laps / child Year 2-3: 42.2 / 45 = 0.9 Km = 5 laps / child Year 4: 42.2 / 30 = 1.4 Km = 7 laps / child Year 5: 42.2 / 25 = 1.7 Km = 9 laps / child Year 6: 42.2 / 20 = 2.1 Km = 11 laps / child

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- The Arat Ber Project will provide water for a population of 3,048 people. This includes:
- 11 water points
- 10 water basins
- a pipeline measuring 3.42km Plus:
- 100 women will receive basic business training
- 80 farmers will receive agricultural training
- 1,200 trees and 500 fruit trees will be planted

Run 4 H2O is a fundraising initiative generating money for HOPE's next water and sanitation project in the rural Ethiopia village of Arat Ber. Pupils from St Bonaventure's will be participating in a sponsored run to help bring clean water to this remote community. Local clean water access will bring improved health and time for education and earning needed money.
