### St Bon's This Week: Nurturing Our Faith and Our World

This week at St Bon's, our Catholic life has been focused on two important aspects of our faith: Caring for God's creation and growing in our relationship with Him.

Our Headteacher's assembly this week centred on our gospel theme for terms 5 and 6 of Care for Our Common Home. The children were reminded of Pope Francis's encyclical, *Laudato Si'*, which calls on all of us to be responsible stewards of the world God has entrusted to us. To bring this message to life, the children listened to the engaging story of Alba, a hundred-year-old fish whose ocean home was affected by rubbish. This narrative illustrated the impact of our actions on the environment and highlighted the positive change that can happen when communities work together to care for it.

Following the assembly, our pupils took time to reflect on what they could do in their own local environment to show care for our common home. Their responses were inspiring and demonstrated a deep understanding of the issue. Ideas such as "we could try to reduce what we use," "say no to plastic when we are in supermarkets," and "plant trees and flowers" showcased their thoughtful engagement with this important message.

This focus on environmental responsibility continued with our Friday Stewards' Assembly. Our school stewards have been busy planning an exciting initiative to support our Live Simply Action Plan: a "Buy Less and Share More" sale. The children are invited to bring in good quality toys and books that they no longer need. Then, on Friday, 6th June, each class will have the opportunity to visit the stalls and swap their items for a "new" treasure! The stewards eloquently explained that this initiative is a practical way to cut down on waste, as swapping toys and books means we don't always need to buy new ones. What a fantastic way to live out our commitment to caring for our planet!

Our Celebration of the Word this week focused on the beautiful Gospel reading for Good Shepherd Sunday from John 10. The children had the opportunity to listen to the words of Psalm 23 and were encouraged to share any thoughts or worries they might have with God in their hearts. This time of reflection helps us to remember that God is always with us, guiding and caring for us like a loving shepherd.

Finally, this weekend holds a very special occasion for many of our Key Stage 2 pupils as they make their First Holy Communion at St Bonaventure's Church. This is a significant step in their spiritual journey, and we pray that they will feel surrounded by love and support as they receive this sacred sacrament. We ask our whole school community to keep these children and their families in their prayers this weekend.

It has been another enriching week at St Bon's, where we continue to learn, grow, and live out our faith in meaningful ways.
