# Catholic Life at St Bons this week - A Week of Hope and Inspiration!

Welcome back! It has been a wonderful and reflective start to the new academic year. We have begun our journey together with a strong focus on our hopes for the future and how we can live out our faith in our daily lives.

### **Our Hopes for the Year Ahead**

We began the term with a whole-school assembly where children and staff shared their hopes and aspirations for the year ahead. It was a lovely opportunity for our school community to come together in thought and prayer.

This theme of hope was beautifully woven into our Start of Year Mass today. The Mass was focused on our new gospel value, and we shared the scripture from Luke 10, the story of The Good Samaritan. During the offertory children from each year group presented candles they had prepared, decorated with their hopes for this school year.

### **Inspired by Blessed Carlo Acutis**

Ahead of the recent canonisation of Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati, we shared a special assembly on the life of Blessed Carlo. We learned how this remarkable young man, who loved computers and video games, used his talents to share his faith.

A key part of Carlo's life was his daily reflection. He would ask himself simple but powerful questions to think about how he could be a better person:

- "How am I with my parents?"
- "How well do I show respect for others at school and home?"
- "How do I get along with my classmates?"

Our children were encouraged to reflect on these questions in their own lives, thinking about how they can be the very best version of themselves .

# Our Gospel Value: Love Thy Neighbour ♡

For the first two terms, our guiding Gospel Value is **'Love thy neighbour'**. This value will be at the heart of all we do. We will be exploring what this means not just in our RE lessons, but across the entire curriculum. In English, Geography, History, and Science, the children's learning will be linked to this theme, helping them to understand more about other people, places, and times, and discover how they can make a positive difference in the world.

We are really excited for the year ahead and look forward to seeing our children grow in faith, love, and learning.


