

Message of the Week - Consumption of food and safeguarding at PFTA events

Mrs Ballentine has made us aware of new government guidance, effective September 2025, which makes supervised eating for children in reception settings more rigorous. There is a requirement that children in Reception class need to be sat down and supervised by someone who has a Paediatric First Aid certificate in order to minimise the risk of choking (<u>Early Years Foundation Stage Statutory Framework for Group and School Based Providers</u>).

With the up-coming School Disco, the PTFA has had to make the decision to **Not Sell Food at the Reception Disco 3:45 - 4pm on the 17th October.**

We apologise if this is upsetting for the children and yourselves as parents, carers, and guardians however, at this moment in time, it ensures that we as a PTFA organisation are complying with this guidance and have minimised the risk of choking at this PTFA event.

If adults bringing children to the Reception Disco bring their own food to the Disco event you do so at your own risk and the adult providing the food will be responsible for ensuring that the child is seated, and closely supervised when eating.

We are continuing to review our health and safety procedures and how this guidance impacts future PTFA events to ensure all of our children's health, safety and wellbeing.

Community Food Pantry Update

September has come and gone and by now the new routines of our individual lives and that of family life should be settling down after the long, hot summer break. With this in mind, perhaps we could consider a new routine, that is to remember to donate to our community food pantry on a regular basis?

To remind you about the food pantry or to introduce you to what it is, here are some pointers:

- The food pantry is found at the back of the church, it is open six days a week, during church opening hours.
- The food pantry operates on a basis of trust, it is not staffed and anyone is able to use it. The uptake is huge, the shelves are emptied on a daily basis.
- The food pantry is intended for people to use when they are finding it hard to make ends meet, it is a short-term solution to providing a simple family meal and / or toiletry. We request the users take no more than they need for a meal, a carrier bag is enough.
- The food pantry provides literature to signpost users to seek longer term solutions to affording the basic needs for family life.
- The food pantry is run by volunteers from our parish and from the residents of Egerton Rd. The residents of Egerton Rd were responsible for initially setting up the food pantry, which has now been running for four years. The volunteers do a weekly shop and restock the food pantry four days a week.
- The food pantry also orders a 'Click and Collect' delivery each week and then delivers this to 'Aid Box Community,' which offers support for refugees and people seeking asylum in Bristol. Aid Box Community is located in St. Andrews, Bristol.

How can I donate?

You can donate non-perishable food and toiletries (please note we cannot accept fresh food as we can't safely store it.)

For example: tinned fish, cooking oil, flour, cooking sauces, cereal, oats, tea, coffee, UHT milk, tinned vegetables, shampoo, sanitary products, washing up liquid etc.

Please put these items donations either in the clear box labelled 'Community Food Pantry Donation Box' at the back of the church or in the box outside the front door of the Presbytery.

Money

There is a 'Food Pantry' button on the Donation Point inside the church if you would like to make monetary donations by card. Or you can give cash to Canon Tom or put it in an envelope through Jenny's door at 57 Egerton Rd. Jenny is a long standing volunteer.
