### Catholic Life at St Bons this week

This week, our school has been busy with activities that bring our Catholic faith to life, centred around our gospel theme of 'Love Thy Neighbour'. From our collective worship to classroom learning and our outreach to the wider world, the children have shown an understanding of what it means to put their faith into action.

**Our Faith in Focus** In our Celebration of the Word assemblies, we reflected on the Gospel of Luke (17:5-10), learning that even a tiny amount of faith, as small as a mustard seed, can achieve incredible things. Key Stage 2 found a perfect example of this in the life of St. Thérèse of Lisieux. They learned about her 'little way' - showing great love for God and others through small, simple, and often unseen acts of kindness.

As we begin the month of October, the month of the Holy Rosary, we are excited to be taking part in the Rosary Challenge set by the Mark 10 Mission. The children were introduced to the challenge this week, and we already have two rosary groups running in school. **Loving Our Global Neighbours with CAFOD** Our focus on love extends to our global family. In our recent CAFOD assembly for the Season of Creation, we learned about the vital work being done in Ethiopia to support communities impacted by severe drought. We were inspired by the stories of local heroes who are planning and leading projects to help their communities thrive.

This term, our school fundraising will support CAFOD's World Gifts programme, helping communities just like those in Ethiopia. We are delighted to announce our Go Bright for Harvest day at the end of term. On this day, the whole school community is invited to dress in their brightest clothes and bring in a donation to support CAFOD's incredible work.

**Living the Theme in Our Classrooms** The theme of 'Love Thy Neighbour' was brought to life in 5B's class assembly today. They class shared how their History topic on World War II helped them understand how communities must work together and support one another through challenging times. Inspired by this, 5B has decided on a wonderful project for their Walk the walk award: they will be creating 'Boxes of Hope' to share love with refugee children here in Bristol.

In Year 2, the children have been exploring the same theme through their Power of Reading book, *The Robot and the Bluebird*. The story tells of a robot with a broken heart who finds friendship and warmth when he offers shelter to a tiny bluebird. The children were challenged to build their own robots at home, and we have been blown away by their amazing creations, which serve as a powerful reminder of how friendship and kindness can mend a broken heart.




**Celebrating Our Shining Stars** Finally, we want to share our pride in two of our pupils who have shown incredible dedication to helping others.



# Community Food Pantry Update

September has come and gone and by now the new routines of our individual lives and that of family life should be settling down after the long, hot summer break. With this in mind, perhaps we could consider a new routine, that is to remember to donate to our community food pantry on a regular basis?

To remind you about the food pantry or to introduce you to what it is, here are some pointers:

- The food pantry is found at the back of the church, it is open six days a week, during church opening hours.
- The food pantry operates on a basis of trust, it is not staffed and anyone is able to use it. The uptake is huge, the shelves are emptied on a daily basis.
- The food pantry is intended for people to use when they are finding it hard to make ends meet, it is a short-term solution to providing a simple family meal and / or toiletry. We request the users take no more than they need for a meal, a carrier bag is enough.
- The food pantry provides literature to signpost users to seek longer term solutions to affording the basic needs for family life.
- The food pantry is run by volunteers from our parish and from the residents of Egerton Rd. The
  residents of Egerton Rd were responsible for initially setting up the food pantry, which has now
  been running for four years. The volunteers do a weekly shop and restock the food pantry four
  days a week.
- The food pantry also orders a 'Click and Collect' delivery each week and then delivers this to 'Aid Box Community,' which offers support for refugees and people seeking asylum in Bristol. Aid Box Community is located in St. Andrews, Bristol.

#### How can I donate?

You can donate non-perishable food and toiletries ( please note we cannot accept fresh food as we can't safely store it.)

For example: tinned fish, cooking oil, flour, cooking sauces, cereal, oats, tea, coffee, UHT milk, tinned vegetables, shampoo, sanitary products, washing up liquid etc.

Please put these items donations either in the clear box labelled 'Community Food Pantry Donation Box' at the back of the church or in the box outside the front door of the Presbytery.

#### Money

There is a 'Food Pantry' button on the Donation Point inside the church if you would like to make monetary donations by card. Or you can give cash to Canon Tom or put it in an envelope through Jenny's door at 57 Egerton Rd. Jenny is a long standing volunteer.
