Our Mission in Action

In our ethos assembly on Monday, we revisited our mission statement, 'Striving to be the best we can, guided by the light of Christ'. Each child took time to reflect on how they are living out this mission and being their best selves at school. In thoughtful oracy discussions, they shared ideas on how we can all contribute to making our school an even calmer and safer environment. From this, we have developed three target behaviours that we will all focus on throughout November. To add a little fun, we will be running a competition between Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 to see which phase can earn the most tokens for demonstrating these positive behaviours!

The Power of Persistent Prayer

Our Celebration of the Word was based on the parable of the persistent widow from Luke 18: 1-8, where Jesus teaches his disciples not to lose heart when they pray. The children in Key Stage 2 had a mature and thoughtful discussion about why God may not seem to answer all our prayers immediately and the great importance of having persistence and commitment in our prayer life. Meanwhile, our younger children in Key Stage 1 were introduced to the Five Finger Prayer, a simple yet powerful way for them to pray for others.

All Aboard the HMS Love thy Neighbour!

We were treated to a fantastic class assembly from 6WA today! Exploring our current gospel theme, the children took us all on an imaginary trip to the Caribbean aboard the 'HMS Love thy Neighbour'. The audience of children and parents learned about the geography, history, and culture of the islands. We were entertained by a live, original retelling of a Caribbean tale and couldn't help but smile as the class performed their rendition of Bob Marley's "Don't Worry". It was a joyful and uplifting end to the week.








Looking Ahead: Celebrating Cultures Week



# **Community Food Pantry Update**

September has come and gone and by now the new routines of our individual lives and that of family life should be settling down after the long, hot summer break. With this in mind, perhaps we could consider a new routine, that is to remember to donate to our community food pantry on a regular basis?

To remind you about the food pantry or to introduce you to what it is, here are some pointers:

- The food pantry is found at the back of the church, it is open six days a week, during church opening hours.
- The food pantry operates on a basis of trust, it is not staffed and anyone is able to use it. The uptake is huge, the shelves are emptied on a daily basis.
- The food pantry is intended for people to use when they are finding it hard to make ends meet, it is a short-term solution to providing a simple family meal and / or toiletry. We request the users take no more than they need for a meal, a carrier bag is enough.
- The food pantry provides literature to signpost users to seek longer term solutions to affording the basic needs for family life.
- The food pantry is run by volunteers from our parish and from the residents of Egerton Rd. The residents of Egerton Rd were responsible for initially setting up the food pantry, which has now been running for four years. The volunteers do a weekly shop and restock the food pantry four days a week.
- The food pantry also orders a 'Click and Collect' delivery each week and then delivers this to 'Aid Box Community,' which offers support for refugees and people seeking asylum in Bristol. Aid Box Community is located in St. Andrews, Bristol.

#### How can I donate?

You can donate non-perishable food and toiletries (please note we cannot accept fresh food as we can't safely store it.)

For example: tinned fish, cooking oil, flour, cooking sauces, cereal, oats, tea, coffee, UHT milk, tinned vegetables, shampoo, sanitary products, washing up liquid etc.

Please put these items donations either in the clear box labelled 'Community Food Pantry Donation Box' at the back of the church or in the box outside the front door of the Presbytery.

## Money

There is a 'Food Pantry' button on the Donation Point inside the church if you would like to make monetary donations by card. Or you can give cash to Canon Tom or put it in an envelope through Jenny's door at 57 Egerton Rd. Jenny is a long-standing volunteer.
