Catholic Life at St Bons this week.

Our week began with our Ethos Assembly, where the school community gathered to reflect on our individual journeys. In our "Sacred Silence," children were encouraged to look inward and consider if they had been their "best selves" over the past week.

We revisited some of our personal resolutions, celebrating the small but significant victories in our classrooms:

- Finn (Year 6) has been courageously embracing challenging Maths problems.
- Florence (5B) has shown resilience in both her academic work and her friendships.
- Gloriana (4D) has made great strides in her focus and engagement in class.

These examples remind us that our mission is not just a statement on a wall, but a daily commitment to growth supported by one another.

Encountering the Saints

We were privileged to welcome Doctor Doyle to lead a special assembly focused on the teachings of Saint John Henry Newman. He spoke to the children about how we care for one another, rooted in Newman's teachings on heart speaking to heart and the values of the Newman trust

A historic moment for the school was when Doctor Doyle shared some grade two relics of St John Henry Newman that have been entrusted to the Newman Trust. For many of our children (and staff), this was their first experience of a relic.

The Celebration of the Eucharist

Wednesday marked a special milestone with our first class Mass of the year, led by 6G. It was lovely to welcome parents and parishioners into school to share the experience with the children

Canon Tom spent time explaining the significance of the various parts of the Mass, from the preparation of the altar to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Following the Mass, he held an insightful Q&A session, where the children asked probing questions about the rituals they had witnessed.

The Gospel (Luke 3:15-22) focused on the Baptism of Jesus. Canon Tom spoke about the children's own baptisms, emphasising that through this sacrament, we all become cherished members of God's family. Our parishioners were particularly touched by the "respectful and calm" atmosphere the children created.



Celebrating Love and Seeking Truth

We closed the week with our "Walk the Walk" Assembly, a time to celebrate faith in action.

- Reviewing 'Love Thy Neighbour': We heard feedback from every class on the impact of their Term 1 and 2 Faith Awards. It was humbling to hear how our children's actions have directly improved the lives of others in our community.
- A New Theme: We have now launched our Gospel theme for Terms 3 and 4: "Seek the Truth." This theme focuses on fairness, justice, and the desire to make a positive difference in the world.

Congratulations to the first recipients of the "Seek the Truth" certificates! These pupils were recognised for being role models of integrity and justice. We look forward to deepening our understanding of this theme through our Power of Reading texts and our wider curriculum over the coming weeks.
